Role of the Office:

The Accelerated Translational Incubator Pilot (ATIP) Program is a focused funding program designed to start or facilitate new, translationally oriented research projects by clinical and non-clinical faculty at Johns Hopkins University.

Intended to promote innovative, translational research and cross-disciplinary collaborations by providing starter funds for projects specifically focused on the development of new therapies (medications, devices, nutrition, behavioral interventions, etc.) or diagnostics, new approaches to prevention or translation of knowledge through the health care system.

- Eligibility

All JHU faculty; Junior faculty in all schools, particularly those new to translational research, are encouraged to apply and will receive special consideration

Funding

Up to \$100,000 in direct costs over 12 months (strongly encouraged to fall within \$25,000-\$50,000); No faculty salary allowed with the exception of Research Associates

Special features

- Awarded projects are milestone-driven to ensure the timely generation of tangible products and outcomes
- Research Navigators provide project management support for funded teams over the course of the award period
- Progress reporting at bimonthly intervals helps Navigators and PIs quickly identify and address barriers to progress
- Projects involving Human Subjects Research and/or Vertebrate animal work require additional review and approval by NIH NCATS.
