What are Dissemination and Implementation Science?

Dissemination is "the targeted distribution of information and intervention materials to a specific public health or clinical practice audience."


 how, when, by whom, and under what circumstances evidence spreads throughout the agencies, organizations, front line workers and consumers of public health and clinical services

Implementation is "the use of strategies to adopt and integrate evidence-based health interventions and change practice patterns within specific settings."

 Seeks to understand the behavior of healthcare professionals and support staff, healthcare organizations, healthcare consumers and family members, and policymakers in context, as key influences on the adoption, implementation and sustainability of evidence-based interventions and guidelines

What does implementation science look like in the wild?



Example 1: "Hybrid" trial

Achieving cardiovascular health equity in community mental health: study protocol for a cluster-randomized hybrid Type 3 effectiveness-implementation trial

- Intervention: IDEAL Goals (a cardiovascular risk reduction program for people with serious mental illness)
- Implementation strategies: Replicating Effective Programs (REP), Coaching, Facilitation
- o **Primary outcome**: number of IDEAL Goals sessions clients receive
- **Study aim**: we use Replicating Effective Programs (REP) as the foundational implementation strategy to test the effects of two additional strategies, Coaching and Facilitation, on improving the number of IDEAL Goals sessions clients receive in community mental health organizations in Maryland and Michigan.



Example 2: Observation + Implementation Feasibility

- Music for Pain Relief (M4PR)
- Can nurses implement music as a pain relief modality for hospital patients?
 - Phase 1: Observed use of music as already occurring (not)
 - Phase 2: Intervened to support nursing provision of music to inpatients to manage pain
 - o Implementation strategies: Education; workflow; Spotify accounts; pre-made evidence-based playlists; facilitation
- The TDF and PRISM implementation frameworks guided the work
- Pre-post nurse attitudes (motivation to implement);
 Documented provision of music; pain scores (NS)



Example 3: Implementation Science

- Title Academic detailing for opioid misuse prevention
- Q: How to minimize risk in opioid prescribing
- Academic detailing model
- What are the implementation strategies: training of AD staff, provider engagement, dissemination
- Follow the Strategic Prevention Framework
- What are the outcomes: knowledge, attitudes, prescribing patterns and overdose outcomes
